The painting has various images that create one picture. The images are clues that let you know which Denver Public Library location it is and where to start your scavenger hunt.


If you don't know which branch location this painting refers to then visit with library staff to have them help you decipher the clues or flip this page over and find the answer.

Ready to start? Flip the page to find your verses.






To solve this clue, look down by your feet,
